AUTUMN TERM EVENTS



Working loosely on the principle of the *Santons* from the Provence region of France, the children are creating the Nativity as if it had taken place in Lincolnshire. Just as the Renaissance artists painted the Nativity in familiar landscapes, so the Santons of Provence stem from the first living Nativity scene, said to have been created in 1223 by St. Francis of Assisi when he was just Francis.

On Thursday 11th December during our Christmas Fair, there will be a chance for you to visit our exhibition of Nativity sets to see how the children have interpreted the Nativity. I'm excited to see their creations, and hope you will be too. We hope you can join us!


